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MEET OUR ADJUDICATORS



WYCLIFFE GORDON

Wycliffe Gordon experiences an impressive career touring the world performing to great acclaim from audiences and critics alike.

Jazz Journalists Association named him "2019 Trombonist of the Year" for the 12th time, and Downbeat Critics Poll named Wycliffe "Best Trombone" again for 2018 (2018, 2016, 2014, 2013 & 2012). In 2018, Wycliffe received the "Louie Award" honoring his dedication and commitment to the music of Louis Armstrong, and received the International Trombone Association Award in 2017, which recognizes the highest level of creative and artistic achievement. In 2015, Wycliffe was presented the *Satchmo* award from the Sarasota Jazz Club, received the *Louis Armstrong Memorial Prize* presented by the Swing Jazz Culture Foundation, and was named *Artist of the Year* (2015) by the Augusta Arts Council. He is also a past recipient of the ASCAP Foundation Vanguard Award, among others.

In addition to an extremely successful solo career, Gordon tours regularly leading his quintet known as *Wycliffe Gordon and His International All-Stars*, headlining at legendary jazz venues and performing arts centers throughout the world. He is commissioned frequently, and has an extensive catalog of original compositions that span the various timbres of jazz and chamber music. Musicians and ensembles of every caliber perform his music throughout the world and his arrangement of the theme song to NPR's "All Things Considered" is heard daily across the globe.

Gordon is a former veteran member of the Wynton Marsalis Septet, the Lincoln Center Jazz Orchestra and has been a featured guest artist on Billy Taylor's "Jazz at the Kennedy Center" Series. Gordon is also one of America's most persuasive and committed music educators; he is Visiting Artist in Jazz Studies at the Arizona State University in Phoenix, and is Director of Jazz Studies at Augusta University in Augusta, GA.

PETER BROCKMAN

Peter Brockman, low brass specialist, is a graduate of Shawano High School and a four-year member of the Kids from Wisconsin. He holds degrees in Music Education and Trombone Performance from Indiana University-Bloomington. Following four years as a member of Las Vegas hotel orchestras, he returned to Indiana University as a graduate assistant in jazz studies. He joined the Interlochen Arts Academy faculty in 1983 as Instructor of Trombone and Low Brass and Director of the Studio Orchestra. Brockman moved to Los Angeles in 1996 and enjoyed a varied freelance career in musical shows (Lion King, Les Mis, Wicked, and others), session work, and orchestral performance (L.A. Chamber Orchestra, Pacific



Symphony, and Santa Barbara Symphony.) Brockman returned to Bloomington in 2004. He currently works throughout the Midwest playing shows, big bands, symphony orchestras and as an adjudicator, recently at the Purdue University Jazz Festival and as a guest artist at the Fairbanks Summer Arts Festival.



LUCAS FISCHER

Lucas Fischer is in his third year at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point majoring in Jazz Studies. He plays all around Wisconsin with different groups ranging from jazz, funk and pop. He performs regularly with his band Substyle and just released an EP with the group. Lucas has also had the privilege of sharing the stage with artists including John Greiner, Victor Garcia, Greg Jasperse, John Raymond, Eric Whitacre and the Minnesota Orchestra. Fischer is an educator as well as a performer and is thankful to have given masterclasses at various high schools and UW-Stevens Point Jazz Fest.



MATHEW BUCHMAN

Pianist, composer, and educator Mathew Buchman is the director of jazz studies at UW Stevens Point, where he joined the faculty in 1995. A native of Appleton, Wisconsin, Buchman earned his B.M. in composition and theory (jazz emphasis) from Lawrence University and M.M. in Improvisation at the University of Michigan. His music for jazz ensemble, orchestra, wind ensemble, choir and chamber groups has been performed by high school, collegiate and professional ensembles around the country.

Mr. Buchman teaches jazz improvisation, composition/arranging, jazz piano and directs the awardwinning UWSP Jazz Ensemble. Buchman served as a faculty leader in London and has directed UW-Stevens Point's summer music camp, Camp COFAC, since 2011.

Buchman's performance experience is diverse. In addition to leading his own groups, he is a regular member of the Central Wisconsin Jazz Ensemble (CWJE), Big Mouth and the Power Tool Horns. Buchman has toured the U.S., Canada and Europe. Buchman has presented for WSMA, WMTA and serves as clinician/adjudicator for jazz festivals around the upper Midwest.

JOE TIERNEY

Joe Tierney is a Shawano Community High School alumnus, class of 2007. He studied history and music (saxophone) at the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire and graduated *summa cum laude* with Honors in 2012. During his time at UWEC he was very involved in the nationally-acclaimed jazz program under the direction of Mr. Robert Baca and had the privilege of performing and recording with many of the biggest names in the jazz world.

Joe currently resides in Fort Pierce, FL where he teaches saxophone and clarinet while continuing to perform extensively both regionally and nationally. This is Joe's ninth year participating in SHAZZ as a guest performer/adjudicator.





RYAN KORB

Ryan Korb teaches Jazz Percussion and Jazz Studies at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point. A native of Billings, Montana, Ryan won the 1990 Governors Scholarship to attend the National Music Camp in Interlochen, Michigan. Ryan now co-leads an Afro-Cuban drum trio, Africa-West. The trio plays original compositions based on traditional African and Cuban music. Among many other concerts, the trio was invited to play at the Percussive Arts Societys International Convention. As a jazz sideman, Ryan has shared the stage with Bill Mays, Russell Malone, Byron Stripling, Aretha Franklin, Frank Sinatra, Jr., John Fedchock, Llew Matthews, Tamir Hendelman, Valerie Naranjo, Barry Olsen, and Kristin Korb. Ryan has played on numerous recordings and has been seen at

numerous jazz festivals and jazz venues internationally.



BRENT TURNEY

Brent Turney is the Professor of Trumpet and Department Chair at the University of Wisconsin at Stevens Point. Before taking the position at UWSP, Brent was adjunct professor at DePaul University teaching jazz and classical trumpet and directing big bands and jazz combos. In 2013 Brent launched a regional chapter of the International Trumpet Guild, the Wisconsin Trumpet Guild with an annual conference. In 2015 Brent launched the Central Wisconsin Jazz Ensemble with an annual concert series. He is an active cross-genre performer throughout the Midwest.

BILL DENNEE

Bill Dennee is the Band Director at Denmark Middle School. He has been in this position for fifteen years and taught previously in the Algoma School District for ten years. His responsibilities include teaching sixth, seventh and eighth grade band, as well as Director of the middle school jazz ensembles.

In addition to teaching, Bill has worked for ten years with the Wisconsin School Music Association Honors Project. He has been trombone coach and coordinator for the jazz ensemble. Bill's current role is Operations Director on the administrative staff. He is also an adjudicator for WSMA, working primarily with Brass Players and Jazz Ensembles.



Bill's career also involves playing professionally in the Green Bay area. For the past twenty-three years he has been performing with Big Mouth and the Power Tool Horns, Bay City Swing, and A Tribute to Frank Sinatra. Big Mouth was awarded "Best of the Bay" in 2009, 2011 and 2012, and was also a winner of a WAMI award in 2011. In addition, Bill has performed locally with The Four Tops, Lee Greenwood, Art Garfunkel, Tom Wopat, Allen Vizutti, James Moody, Bill Watrous, Eric Marienthal, Gordon Goodwin, Wayne Bergeron, Carl Allen, Aretha Franklin and the Jimmy Dorsey Orchestra.



JOHN GREINER

John Greiner is a graduate of Wausau West High School. He was a member of the United States Air Force Band from 1983-1987. After military service, John was awarded a scholarship to the Berklee College of Music in Boston, MA where he graduated with a bachelor's degree in Woodwind Performance. John stayed in the Boston area for the next 13 years, maintaining a busy free-lance performance and teaching schedule. John is currently on the faculty of The Wausau Conservatory of Music as Instructor of Saxophone and Jazz Studies. Along with leading his SwingShift Big Band (John Greiner's SwingShift Big Band), he also performs with his jazz trio and quartet as well as free-lance performances with many bands throughout the state of Wisconsin.

DAVID STORY

David Story is the Associate Professor of Bass at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point (UW-SP). He has performed throughout the U.S. and is active as a classical soloist, chamber and orchestral musician, and freelance jazz artist. Story has performed with numerous Broadway shows and in live chamber music broadcasts for both Michigan and Wisconsin Public radio. He is a two-time semi nationalist in the International Society of Bassists classical soloist competition and a recipient of three Downbeat awards as a member of the Kruiziki Transatlantica Quintet. Since his appointment at UW-SP in 2005, Story has taught courses in jazz improvisation, music history, music theory, jazz ensemble, jazz combos, and chamber strings. He received his M.M. in



performance from Western Michigan University where he studied with Tom Knific as a graduate fellow. He earned his B.M. in performance from UW-SP under virtuoso Catalin Rotaru.



BRIAN FORD

Professional drummer, Brian Ford, has been playing and recording in the Milwaukee area for the past 30 years. He specializes in drum set and Latin Percussion and is currently playing with a variety of musical groups including Milwaukee Jazz Band OPUS, The Tom Anthony Band, The Tom Source Group also out of Milwaukee, and Triad based out of Kenosha. In addition to performing, Brian is also a seasoned percussion instructor and has developed and published a series of instructional drum set method books. In addition to working with local high schools, Brian also offers private instruction at Pacetti's Maestro of Music Store and The Music Center, located in Kenosha, Wisconsin.



BRUCE HERING

Bruce Hering spent most of his 32-year teaching career leading the bands at Eau Claire Memorial High School. His main instrument is trumpet, which he uses as his "teaching instrument" along with some piano. Hering started at Memorial High School in 1990. The small program quickly grew to nearly 500 students with 6 concert bands, 5 jazz ensembles, and 3 marching bands. In 2010, he was moved to Eau Claire North, where he stayed for three years until retiring. Hering led eight jazz bands to the "Super Bowl" of jazz festivals: the prestigious Essentially Ellington Festival and Competition held in New York City's Jazz at Lincoln Center: seven times with Eau Claire Memorial and once with Eau Claire North. Hering's award-winning bands have traveled far and wide, including festivals and jazz clubs in New Orleans, Kansas City, Chicago, Honolulu, and New York City. He currently resides happily in Madison, WI with his lovely wife, Lisa O'Brien.


PATRICK PHALEN

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
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
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MEET OUR BANDS

Shawano Community High School Jazz I & II and Combo **Christopher Kent**, **Director**

The jazz program at Shawano Community High School has 2 one credit year-round courses. These groups of 20+ students rehearse for 88 minutes every other school day. Shawano Jazz I has placed in the top three, 6 of the last 7 appearances at the UW-Eau Claire Jazz Festival and have won their class for the last 10 consecutive appearances at the Rolling Meadows Jazz Festival as well as winning their division for the past 3 consecutive appearances at the Purdue Jazz Festival. Jazz I was also chosen to perform at the afternoon concert for the Wisconsin Association of School Boards state convention in 2014. The band takes special pride in the energy they bring to each performance, in addition to being technically and stylistically precise.

Shawano Community Middle School Jazz Band **Chad Bromeisl, Director**

The jazz program at Shawano Community Middle School is made up of 7th and 8th grade students. The group of 20 plus students meets every other day for one class period. This band also performs for school events and concerts. This is the eleventh year they are participating in SHAZZ!

The Sun Prairie High School Jazz Ensemble I is an extracurricular extension of the high school band program in Sun Prairie. The high school of 1750 students includes grades 10-12 and is located 10 miles northeast of the Wisconsin capitol city of Madison. The Sun Prairie High School Jazz Ensemble rehearses three times per week with an additional weekly student run sectional. The band has appeared at the Midwest Clinic, Wisconsin State Music Convention, numerous jazz festivals and toured Germany. They have also been a 13 time national finalist in the "Essentially Ellington" Festival in New York, placing 3rd, three times in that competition. The jazz program also hosts an annual jazz festival that brings in bands from around the state and clinicians from around the country. 
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
